

# NOTICE OF RACE

2008 I-LYA Travelers Series  
ISC JUNIOR Regatta  
August 16, 2008  
Indianapolis Sailing Club



## 1 RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by 'rules' as defined by the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of US SAILING, the rules of the Thistle, Club 420, Club FJ, Laser, Laser Radial, and the Optimist classes, except as any of these class rules are altered by this Notice of Race and/or the Sailing Instructions.

## 1.2 ALCOHOL & DRUGS

Per US SAILING Regulation 5.03, no competitor shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, and distilled spirits) or use any controlled substance (marijuana, cocaine, etc.), the possession of which is unlawful. This regulation is in effect during the entire event, from arrival through departure.

On report of a violation of this regulation, a hearing will be held generally in accord with the recommendations of Appendix L of the RRS. Penalties for a violation of the regulation may range from a reprimand to dismissal from the regatta. Additionally, further action under rule 69 may be recommended by the hearing officers.

The officers for hearing a violation of US SAILING Regulation 5.03 will consist of the Chief Judge, acting as chairman of the hearing, and a hearing jury.

## 2 ALTERATIONS OF CLASS RULES

The class rules will be used except that RRS 60.1 (a) is changed to prohibit a boat from protesting another boat for an alleged breach of a class rule requiring class membership or imposing a weight limit.

## 3 ADVERTISING

Advertising is in accordance with the ISAF Advertising Code (Appendix 1) and the relevant class rules.

## 4 CLASSES of SAILBOATS

Thistle with skipper and crew of two, Club 420 and Club FJ with skipper and crew of one, and Laser, Laser Radial, and Optimist with skipper.

## **5 ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY**

### **5.1 AGE**

Competitors for all classes must NOT become 19 years old before Jan 1, 2009.

### **5.2 US SAILING MEMBERSHIP**

Membership in US SAILING is recommended, but not required. Non US Sailing sailors are encouraged to join US Sailing and can join online at [www.ussailing.org](http://www.ussailing.org)

## **6 APPLICATION**

Application shall be made by completing the entry form and returning it with a check for the entry fee payable to: Indianapolis Sailing Club. Entry fee may be paid when registering at arrival.

## **7 FEES**

The entry fee for all classes is \$20 for each competitor, with a \$5 discount for US Sailing membership. The entry fee includes Friday evening cook out, fruit and light snacks before sailing, concluding meal, and prizes. The Friday evening cook out is complementary for all present. Concluding meals for accompanying personnel may be purchased at Check In. Entry fees mailed will be refunded if mailed and the competitor is unable to attend.

## **9 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

The sailing instructions will be available at registration and on the web at [indianapolssailing.org](http://indianapolssailing.org).

## **10 SAILS**

All sails shall display a number.

## **11 MEASUREMENT**

Each competitor will be responsible for their boats being in compliance with the class rules.

## **12 SCORING**

The Low-Point Scoring System, Appendix A of the RRS, will apply for all classes. A maximum of six races are scheduled, of which one race shall be completed to constitute the regatta. If five or more races are sailed, a boat's single worst score shall be discarded.

**13 PRIZES**

Prizes shall be given to all first, second, and third place overall finishes, and to all participants in the Optimist Green fleet. Prizes may also be given for other reasons.

**14 SAFETY**

A Coast Guard-approved PFD must be worn and fully secured at all times while afloat, except for brief periods while adding or removing clothing. Whistles permanently attached to the PFDs are recommended

**15 Power Boats**

Coaches and parents bringing power boats for support and observation are asked to email or call the regatta chairman as ISC has limited parking and launching facilities. Launching and recovery will be coordinated to not interfere with sailboat launching and recovery.

The Indianapolis Sailing Club is located at the corner of Brooks School Road and Fall Creek Road and sails on Geist Reservoir. ISC also has an unencrypted Wi-Fi that is available for use.
